

Feral Pig Panel Trap

What is the Feral Pig Panel Trap?

Council's new feral pig panel trap and trailer is a portable panel trap for the use of officers and landholders in reducing the impacts of feral pigs in Somerset.

The trap can be set up to make one large trap about 35m^2 or into two smaller traps depending on site requirements. The trap can also be fitted with a remotely activated gate that works off a mobile phone.

The trap will be particularly useful where landholders are being impacted by larger numbers of pigs.

The trap and trailer were purchased in 2015 through the Australian Government funded, SEQ Drought Assistance Feral Animal Management Project.



Who can utilise the trap?

Somerset residents who are experiencing feral pig problems, particularly with large numbers of feral pigs, can utilise the feral pig panel trap.

What are the requirements?

Residents wishing to participate in the program must:

- Be a landholder or resident of Somerset.
- Have reported a complaint, attack or sighting of a restricted invasive animal;
- Submit a Trapping Request Form to Council;
- Undergo a site assessment by one of Council's pest management officers.
